 <h2>History</h2> <p>Goose Fair dates from 1284 and takes place in the first week of October.</p> <p>Goose Fair is actually named after the thousands of geese which were walked from Lincolnshire to be sold at the fair!</p> <p>The Cheese Riots of 1766 caused chaos in Nottingham where the Mayor was knocked over by a huge rolling cheese!</p> <p>Goose Fair was originally held on St Matthew's Day on 21st September but was moved to October in 1752.</p>	 	<h2>Design Technology</h2> <p>A gear is a toothed wheel that interlocks with another toothed wheel and can change the speed of moving parts.</p>  <p>Rotary motion is when a fairground ride spins in one direction such as a carousel.</p>  <p>Oscillating motion in a mechanism is where a ride swings from side to side like a pirate ship!</p>  <p>A lever is the simplest form of mechanism. A level is a stiff bar that moves around a pivot.</p>
